



# BIOGRAPHY

### COLONEL DEANE E. THOMEY

Col. Deane E. Thomey assumed command of the 111th Attack Wing on April 1, 2021 at Biddle Air National Guard Base in Horsham, Pennsylvania. As Wing Commander, he supervises the Wing and its subordinate units which include 111th Operations Group, the 111th Medical Group, the 111th Mission Support Group, and the 201st Rapid Engineer Deployable Heavy Operational Repair Squadron (RED HORSE) Detachment 1. In total, Col. Thomey commands more than 900 ready Airmen in executing the Wing's mission to support multi-domain global operations, safeguarding the homeland and supporting Pennsylvania communities by building partnerships with local civil authorities.

Col. Thomey, a native of Sherwood, Arkansas, enlisted in the Arkansas Air National Guard in 1988 and was assigned to the 123rd Reconnaissance Technical Squadron, Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas. In 1992, upon graduating from the Academy of Military Science, McGhee Tyson Air National Guard Base, Knoxville, Tennessee, he commissioned as a second lieutenant and was assigned to the 189th Civil Engineering Squadron, Little Rock Air Force Base, Arkansas, as a civil engineering officer. He attended Undergraduate Pilot Training at Columbus Air Force Base, Mississippi, graduating in November 1996. Following training, Col. Thomey was assigned to the 154th Training Squadron, Little Rock AFB, Arkansas, as a C-130 pilot. In 2001, he transferred to the 184th Fighter Squadron, 188th Fighter Wing, Ebbing Air National Guard



Base, Fort Smith, Arkansas, where he served as an F-16 and A-10 pilot, a range control officer, and command post chief. In August 2012, Col. Thomey assumed command of the 188th Logistics Readiness Squadron, Fort Smith, Arkansas. During this time he deployed to Kabul, Afghanistan in support of Operation FREEDOM'S SENTINEL, serving as the chief of logistics, 9th Air Expeditionary Task Force – Afghanistan / NATO Air Command – Afghanistan. In December 2016, he transferred to the Air National Guard Readiness Center, Joint Base Andrews, Maryland, in the Air National Guard Directorate of Plans and Programs where he served in several roles culminating as chief, Combat Forces Branch. In October 2018, Col. Thomey became the chief, Aircrew Task Force Current Operations Division, Training and Readiness Directorate, Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia. Beginning in June 2020, Col. Thomey served as the Director, Air National Guard Director's Action Group (DAG), Office of the Director of the Air National Guard, the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia. In this role, he was responsible for developing strategic Air National Guard initiatives for implementation with various government officials, agencies, Department of Defense and National Guard Bureau representatives, and he provided research, analyses, and communication expertise to the director to ensure effective advocacy for policy positions impacting the future of the Air National Guard

As a command pilot, Col. Thomey has 1870 hours of military flight time in the T-37, T-38, C-130, F-16, MQ-9 and A-10, and he is a veteran of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM with 73 hours of combat flight time. In his civilian capacity, he is an account manager for a global industrial automation company.
